Butser Ancient Farm in Hampshire

10 This farm is a special museum about England's past. Here you can see houses in which people used to live a long time ago. You can find out more about life in England in the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age and you can see how the Vikings and the Romans lived and worked. The workshops there are fun too!

The Lunt Roman Fort in Warwickshire

15 Here you can see what a real Roman fort looked like. Some parts of it are 2,000 years old. You can do activities like wear costumes and win battles like a Roman.

The Roman lighthouse at Dover Castle in Kent

20 This is the only Roman lighthouse in England that you can still see today. It's at the sea-side and in the past it was more than 25 metres high. The Romans used to have a fire in it so their ships could see the coast at night.

Framlingham Castle in Suffolk

This big castle is more than 800 years old. You can walk around the castle – even on the walls! – and learn a lot about life in a castle. I love old castles! So this was my favourite sight.

Windsor Castle in Berkshire

25 Windsor Castle is one of the homes of the Queen and the royal family. The Queen spends a lot of time there. That's why visitors can't look at all the rooms in the castle.

I really had a good time and I took more than 200 photos! 😊

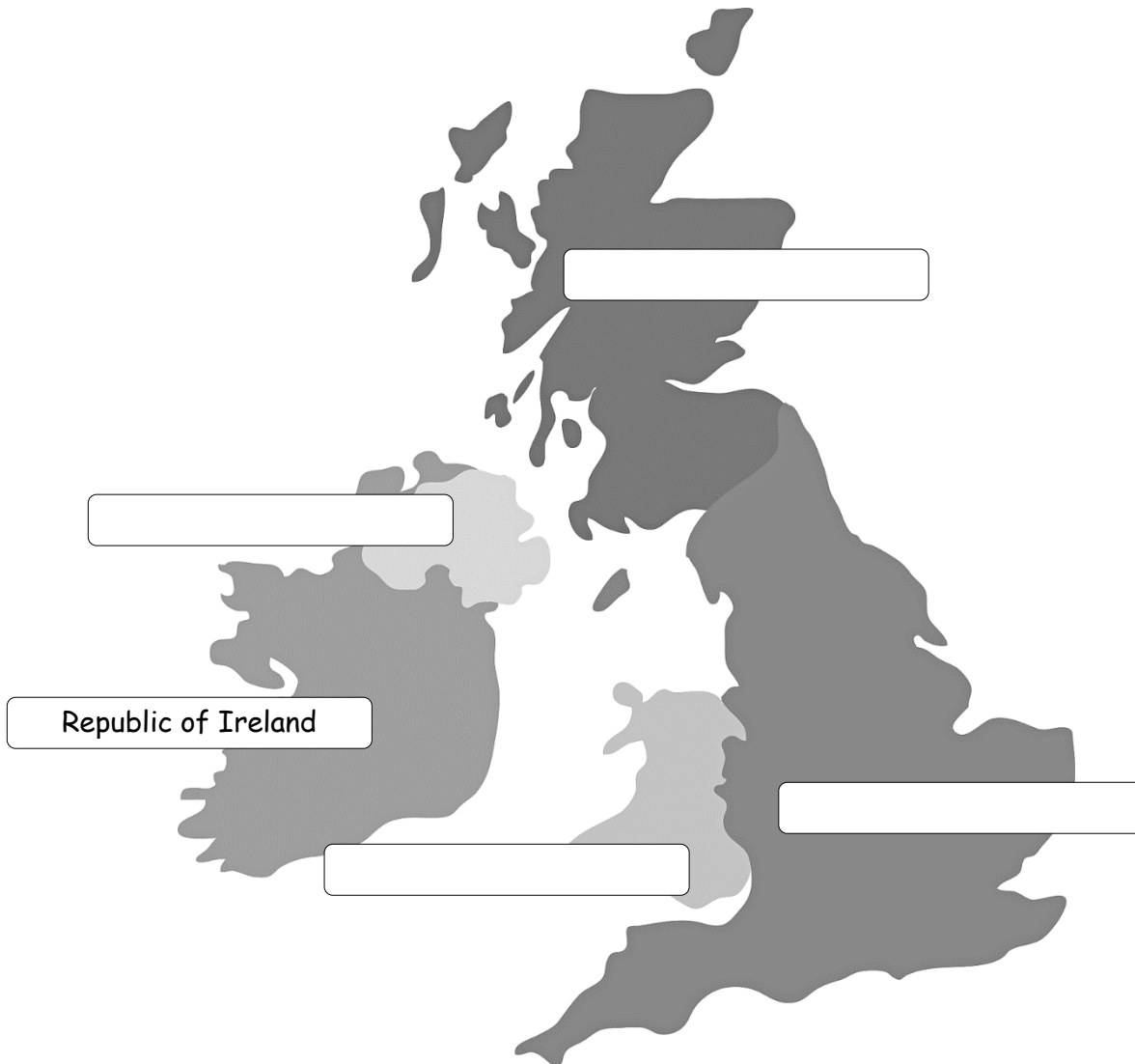
